I am Remi from France. I leave near Paris where I have just finished my studies in social career. I have been very interested in Romania since I came the first time in 2003 and the second time in 2008. I chose to do an EVS project in Romania because I would like to spend more time in the country and discover the daily life. My EVS project in Club VOLTIN - Braila is about activities based on non-formal education. I like very much to play games with children, for example in the kindergarden or in schools.

We play some mime games, theatre and generally games for personal development and games which help you to know you better. I do also, music activities because I play saxophone. I played during a festival of the "Clubul Voltin" in August and I play with friends too. In addition, I go to the highschool for speaking in French with students and I find this very interesting. Generally, between us EVS volunteers I spoke in english. I was able to speak to understand and be understanding. I learnt english before at school in France so this language was not a problem to use it during the activities, and at home with me roommates. A basic level of english is enough to comunicate during and EVS. First, I began to learn romanian language at home in france for my pleasure because I was two times in Romania in the past. I like to be integrate in a country generaly and the first step is to lean the language. Because I knew romanian, it was more easy in the activities with chilrend and teachers for example.

I had the main occasion to use my mother tongue when I was in highschools of Braila. First there, I met the french teachers with who I was able to speak french in a very good way. Some of romanian students speak very good french and pronunciate it very good. It was very interesting for me to listen some foreign students speaking in my mother tongue. I also had the opportunity to help a student at home with french. All this activities bring to me the capacity to be patient and to take more care about the people with who I speak and also how I speak.

I chose to stay more with romanian people that with my EVS collegues to know more about the culture, the traditions and the way of life of romanian people. Concerning my activities, the best way to learn was to be confronted directly with the children and the teachers in the schools.
