



JEUNESSE POUR L'EMPLOI

La rencontre/ séminaire aura lieu du 25 août au 3 septembre 2014 à Landshut (Allemagne) et est financée par l'Union Européenne. Les participants paient une contribution de 30% des frais de transport.

40 jeunes de six pays (Egypte, Russie, Pologne, France, Suède et Allemagne) traiteront la question du chômage des jeunes. En décrivant la situation dans leurs pays, ils devront démontrer des exemples de meilleures pratiques de l'emploi des jeunes, et en petits groupes, découvrir quelles sont les options à l'étranger pour l'emploi (travail, formations, stages, Service volontaire européen, Au pair, programmes « Voyager et travailler ») et comment la mobilité y est encouragée. Les participants auront la possibilité de faire une demande pour un projet ou un séjour à l'étranger au cours du séminaire.

Les jeunes donneront un résumé des politiques du marché du travail de leurs pays, particulièrement concernant l'emploi des jeunes. Puis, en petits groupes, ils découvriront que les possibilités de participation politique sont là. Avec le soutien d'un leader ils écriront des motions et des résolutions pour les parlements et les comités. Ces motions et résolutions seront votées dans un Parlement Jeunesse transnationale et présentées lors d'une conférence de presse sur le chômage des jeunes.

Un groupe filmera le projet pour en faire un documentaire.

Les jeunes pourront rester dans l'auberge de jeunesse Landshut. La langue de travail sera l'anglais.
